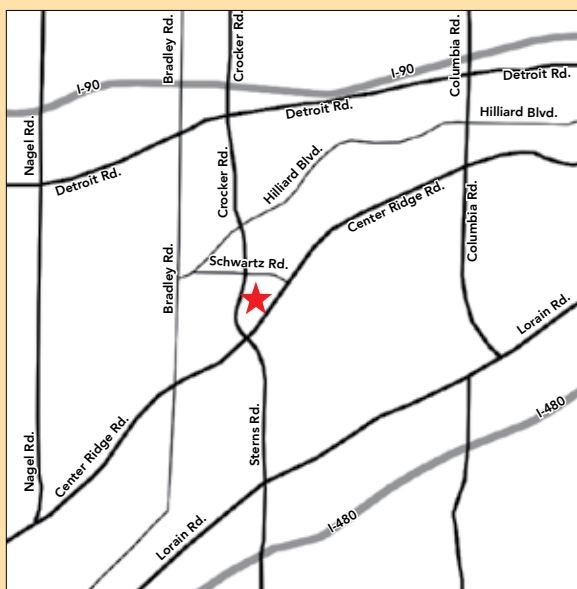

Now in its 21st year, the festival will feature more than 200 of America's finest artists and crafts persons, who will be showcased on the beautiful grounds of the St. John Medical Center campus in Westlake, Ohio.

Attendance for 2013's Festival of the Arts exceeded 15,000 people, with activities for young and old alike. The 3-day event features live musical entertainment, a variety of food stations and hands-on children's craft activities.

Festival of the Arts is open to the public, free of charge. Attendees are encouraged to donate non-perishable food items for local hunger centers. In 2013, more than 2,500 pounds of food were collected to help those in need.

For the 21st consecutive year, artists from throughout the country will gather in Westlake to proudly display their array of arts and crafts at the St. John Medical Center Festival of the Arts. Located 20 minutes west of downtown Cleveland, the event will feature the talents of about 200 exhibitors, whose creations range from pottery, sculptures, jewelry, fabrics and leather to metalwork, woodwork, painting and photography.

"What makes the Festival of the Arts so unique is the variety of artisans that attend and showcase their works of arts," says Patrick Garmone, director of marketing for St. John Medical Center. "We are fortunate to have some of the finest artists in the country attend the event, and many create their artwork during the weekend, allowing festival-goers to observe the creative process."

The center will host the festival along a beautiful, half-mile walking path shaded by trees and overlooking a pond, providing the perfect backdrop for the artists' works. The show also will include food vendors, a children's craft station and other activities. For the second time in festival history, the event will have a Beer & Wine Garden available for people to stop by, relax and listen to this year's musical entertainment, which includes a Latin jazz singer, a country western band and a country, Cajun and blues band.

While the festival is free, guests are encouraged to donate nonperishable food items. Last year, the St. John Medical Center collected more than 2,500 pounds of food, which was donated to local hunger shelters. The event has been blossoming for 21 years and has grown into one of the premier arts and crafts events in Northeast Ohio, attracting more than 15,000 guests last year.

"Since its inception, the festival has served as a thank you to the community for its ongoing support. That is why we do not charge an admission fee," Garmone says. "We also want residents to enjoy our beautiful campus, which boasts 68 acres. It makes for an idyllic setting."

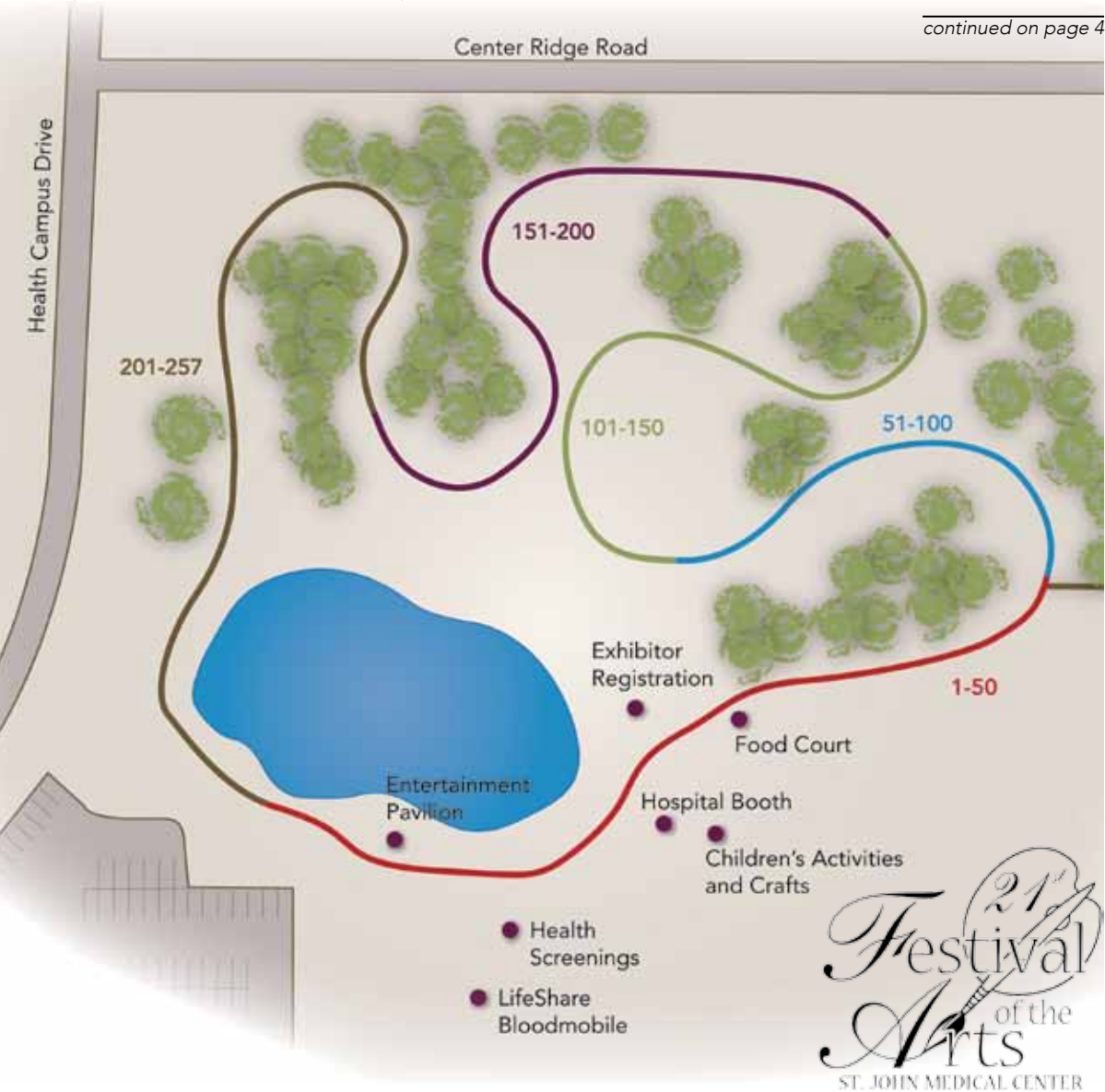

"The Custom Cutting block is a small operation (no employees!) located in Madison, Ohio. We are not a mass production factory. Each piece is individually hand-crafted, one at a time. Every one of our cutting boards and blocks has its own character and unique features. Stuart Henderlich has been woodworking for most of his life and has recently focused on creating cutting boards and blocks. Most often when our cutting boards are sold, people respond, "I can't possibly cut this, it is too beautiful." This is where art meets function. Our cutting boards belong on the counter for all to see, not hidden away inside a cabinet.

"We have noticed that almost half of the cutting boards we have sold have been for gifts. 
