# Plan for the Solar Eclipse

At about 3:13 pm on Monday, April 8, 2024, Bay Village will be in the path of totality for a solar eclipse. Skies have been clear in Bay Village on April 8 for 3 of the last 9 years.

Plan ahead:

- Cahoon Road in Cahoon Memorial Park will be closed, similar to closures at Bay Days. Parking will be limited. Roads around the park may have limited access or be closed.
- Parking rules will be enforced. Do not park on public property except for designated parking spaces.
- Stores and businesses may be closed or overwhelmed that day. Call ahead to confirm.
- If you plan to have work done at your home that day, consider rescheduling.

- · City facilities, including the Gazebo and Bay Lodge, will not be available to rent just before and during the event.

# **Fatal Car Accident in Avon Lake**

On Thurs., Jan 18 at about 8:54 pm. Avon Lake Police and Fire were dispatched to the area of Lake Road and Vineyard for a motor vehicle accident with injuries. The single motor vehicle traveling westbound on Lake went off the right side of the roadway and struck two utility poles. The 36-year old male driver was found to be deceased. The accident is being investigated by Avon Lake Police and the Ohio State Highway Patrol. Lake Road was closed between Harvey Parkway and Armour Road for three hours. The crash remains under investigation.

stop the vehicle which was now operating with a flat tire. The Hyundai struck the guard rail at Detroit Rd which finally disabled the vehicle enough where it could be boxed in by cruisers. The man was taken into custody before he could take off again and cause damage to other motorists. The 33yo Amherst man was transported to the hospital to be treated for non-life threatening injuries sustained from the crashes. The man appeared intoxicated and suspected oxycodone pills were recovered from the scene. The driver was charged with felony failure to comply for not stopping his vehicle when directed as well as OVI. He refused to submit to a chemical test therefore his license was suspended immediately. Amazingly, the suspect did not strike any other vehicles during this incident. The suspect appeared in Rocky River Municipal Court on 1/8/24 where he waived his preliminary hearing. The case was bound over to the Cuyahoga County Grand Jury and the man was transported to the county jail on a \$10,000 cash or surety bond.
