

Community Health Partners: Breast Imaging Center of Excellence

Women in the Lorain County and Cuyahoga County areas now can experience greater peace of mind when it comes to breast health. The Women's Health Center at Community Health Partners (CHP) Regional Medical Center has been designated as a Breast Imaging Center of Excellence (BICOE) by the American College of Radiology (ACR).



"The BICOE designation tells our patients that we are dedicated to excellence," states Carrie Jankowski, director of diagnostic imaging services and biometrics. "Patients can rest assured that we meet all of the standards set forth by the American College of Radiology, and that we have high-quality equipment and a qualified staff to provide the best possible care."

With the support and encouragement of Francis Kearney, M.D., radiology medical director, and a staff dedicated to maintaining the highest standards, Jankowski says the Women's Health Center worked diligently to obtain all of the American College of

Radiology's necessary accreditations to earn BICOE status.

By awarding facilities the status of a Breast Imaging Center of Excellence, the American College of Radiology recognizes breast imaging centers that have earned accreditation in both their voluntary and mandatory breast-imaging accreditation programs and modules. To receive BICOE designation, a medical facility must be fully accredited in mammography, stereotactic breast biopsy, breast ultrasound and ultrasound-guided breast biopsy.

Experts in the field, such as board-certified physicians and medical physicists, perform peer-review evaluations in each breast imagining modality. Based on these reviews, they determine that the facility has achieved high practice standards in image quality, personnel, equipment, quality control and quality assurance.

BICOE designation remains in effect as long as the center remains accredited in all required breast imaging services.

CHP's Women's Health Center features digital mammography technology and technologists who are registered in mammography. Women receive one-on-one care in a private location dedicated to breast health.

The American College of Radiology, headquartered in Reston, Virginia, is a national organization serving more than 32,000 diagnostic/interventional radiologists, radiation oncologists, nuclear medicine physicians and medical physicists with programs for focusing on the practice of medical imaging and radia-


New Life Hospice Celebrates More Than 30 Years of Service

A variety of sponsorship opportunities are still available, as well as the opportunity for former patients' families to honor their loved ones in the event program through the purchase of a patron ticket.



Selection for the list is based solely on objective statistical data and uses peer-review methodologies to assure transparency.

"For two successive years, CHP and Community Health Partners has earned

this Top 10 distinction from Thomson Reuters which shows that quality healthcare remains the number one priority for Community Health Partners and the other 34 hospitals in the CHP system," said Edwin Oley, president of Community Health Partners. "It has long been our stance to provide our patients and their families with a level of compassion and expertise that centers on their personal needs. Additionally, the firm noted that the average length of stay was more than half a day shorter than similar systems and patients had better longer-term outcomes.

According to Michael Connelly, president and CEO of Catholic Healthcare Partners, the distinction gives further evidence that the health system is maintaining its goal of excellence in healthcare. "We are hon-

ored to be recognized again as a Thomson Reuters Top 10 Health System. 


